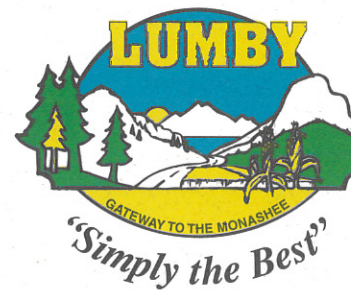

PAT DUKE ARENA:

MONTH: April - May 2014

Any Unscheduled Closures:

One – Lacrosse cancelled due to Wild Land Fire Fighters staying in Arena for flooding project May 6th.

New room for referees and community hall storage to be built on South West corner of Arena – with no purchase of sea-can for storage necessary. Funds to be used for new room construction.

Vehicles- short one vehicle as 1992 Dodge was stolen May 29, 2014 – dealing with this issue and looking at replacement with alternate vehicle. New policy that vehicles are stored inside or in Lumby Public Works compound.

Lumby Pool Report - Tuesday June 3rd

We have been open officially since the 20th of May, but functionally only since the 26th of May. We have had 291 public and lane swimmers in the pool as of June 1st.

As of May 30th, our income is \$3159.65, mostly for passes and swimming lessons.

Our early bird sale on passes continues until June 13th, and we anticipate selling more passes before then as we have had quite a few inquiries about pass prices and when the sale is over. To date we have sold:

- Family Passes: 22
- Single (19+) Passes: 15
- Youth Passes: 6

Lesson registration for June and July is underway already. Our first Spring lesson set began June 2nd. We have 8 children registered in this set. The next set begins on June 16th, and we currently have 10 children registered, and 6 pencilled in for that set. Registration usually increases as we get closer to the start date of a set. We also have 9 children already registered for the first two Summer lesson sets in the beginning of July.

Our first adult set is scheduled to start on June 7th, and although we have not had any registrations yet, we have had interest in the set. We have changed the time of the lesson from once a week Wednesday nights to Sat/Sun from 4:30-5:30 for four weeks. With this change we hope to make the program more available to users, and also to give them and their instructor more time to work on their skills. Although the registration for last year was low, I was pleased to note that two of the adult swimmers I taught last year have purchased passes this year and begun participating in lane swim this year.

Our school board swim lessons have been progressing well. This year we have switched to using the Red Cross Swim@School program, which has streamlined teaching for our instructors, and improved the level of activity and participation for the children. It has also enabled us to make the school board swim lessons more structured and standardized than they have ever been before. After arranging lessons with Cherryville Elementary, Lavington Elementary, and JW Inglis Elementary, we had several spaces left open, so we organized a swim set for the Homeschool students in Lumby, and also for Cedar Bridge School. Despite strike days falling on two of our scheduled lesson days, we've been able to re-schedule to ensure that students are getting all four classes per set. In the 2 sets currently running, we have 136 children participating. Our next two sets begin on June 9th and 10th, and we have 182 children currently registered. There is one class we still do not have class numbers for yet, so that set will likely be closer to 200 participants. CBSS is also bringing classes in on some afternoons during PE for fun swimming.

We are already having inquiries about the start of the summer schedule, especially our Aquatic Fitness programs, AquaFit and AquaZumba. The Lumby Summer Day Camp will be attending the pool again on Tues/Thurs afternoons, and we are also expecting large groups of Girl Guides in July coming out from the Girl Guides of Canada International Camp. The Vernon Syncho Club has arranged to come out and train at the pool Friday afternoons in July to train for the BC Summer Games. The Pathfinders have also arranged with us to have their general meeting at the pool on Monday June 9th.

We are looking forward to a busy fun-filled summer!
