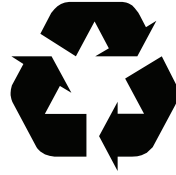


What happens to your recyclables?

Plastics: Coloured plastics are usually ground up and used to make black or grey plastic products such as garden edging and pails. White or clear plastics are more valuable because they can be made into plastic products of any colour.



Aluminum: Can be made into aluminum products, such as foils and new cans.

Tin Cans: These are made into products such as rebar for construction purposes.

Brush and Woodpiles: Can be made into woodchips and other assorted items.

Glass jars: Are ground up and made into fiberglass insulation, reflective paints and signs, new glass containers and sand for sandblasting.

Paper and cardboard fibers: Are used to make new newspapers, office paper and towels.

NEW Secure Load Bylaw (No. 2097) **Non-secured loads of refuse will be subject to penalties at all Regional Landfills**



Effective immediately, all loads entering Regional Recycling and Disposal facilities must be properly secured so as to prevent materials from blowing or falling off the vehicle while in transit. Starting January 1, 2006, fees doubled for non-secured loads entering regional landfills (minimum \$10 per load). Only one warning per customer.

Each load will be assessed to determine if the refuse or recyclable material is properly and securely contained on and in the vehicles entering the sites. A Notice of Violation will be issued that can be appealed.

We are first and foremost a recycling facility. We want to ensure our landfill space lasts as long as possible, rather than building a new landfill or making customers drive further to our other sites.

**Residents in our community are highly motivated recyclers.
Let's keep up the good work!**

The following items must be recycled:

If not, you face a possible fine of 50% of your normal tipping fee, to be added to your disposal fee. Each of these items has a pile at the landfill. Please do not throw anything else into the piles.

You can make it easier and quicker to recycle at our facility:

Before going to the landfill, load your vehicle by grouping materials together by type.

It will be easier for you to unload into the right piles once at the landfill.

Cardboard cannot be dumped along with garbage. If you have cardboard in your load, please empty everything except the cardboard from your load in the appropriate locations and then return to the scales to be weighed. The cashier will let you know where the cardboard can be left, free-of-charge.

By separating the cardboard and other mandatory recyclables from your load, you will save considerable money.

To make recycling easier, we can show you where to properly dispose of your items. Questions? - we are happy to assist!

The following items must be separated and recycled:

CARDBOARD

- All cardboard **must be recycled**
- Place cardboard in containers provided at the sites (large yellow or green metal containers)



METAL (items containing at least 75% metal)

- Drive to metal pile and place items at base of pile
- Do not throw anything but METAL in this pile!
- Salvage only permitted with permission from operator

REFRIDGERATION UNITS

(e.g. freezers, fridges, air conditioners)

- Drive to metal pile and place item near pile as indicated by signage, along with other units
- The refrigerant (e.g. freon) will be removed



TIRES

- Drive to tire stockpile as indicated by signs for all passenger vehicle tires and neatly stack tires in piles
- Off road tires shall be buried with refuse

CONCRETE, BRICKS, BLOCKS and ASPHALT

- Drive to designated stockpile (look for signs or ask attendant) and place material at base of pile

BATTERIES (wet and dry cell)

- Drive to battery stockpile and place batteries in black tubs or on pallets provided



PROPANE TANKS

- Drive to propane tank stockpile (as indicated by signs) and place tanks neatly on the ground

YARD WASTE (BRUSH, PRUNINGS, LEAVES, GRASS)

- Drive to yard waste pile as designated by signage or instructed by operators and place material at base of pile (**Empty all bags/containers**)
- Do not throw anything but yard waste in the pile

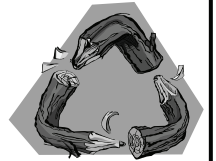


GYP SUM (wallboard and drywall)

- Drive to gypsum recycling container or building and deposit all recyclable drywall/wallboard inside (look for signs)
- Exempt - Drywall with mesh, stucco, and/or vinyl on it
- Accepted - Drywall with tile attached

WOOD – DIMENSIONAL NON-TREATED

- Drive to wood stockpile as designated by signage or instructed by operators. Place material at base of pile
- Do not throw anything else in this pile EXCEPT wood! (contamination impacts use of material)



WOOD – DIMENSIONAL – TREATED

- Drive to wood stockpile as designated by signage or instructed by operators and place material at base of pile
- Do not throw anything else in this pile EXCEPT treated wood

BLUE BAG MATERIALS

(paper, newspaper, cardboard, plastic film, plastic containers, tin cans, aluminum foil & containers)

- Place Blue Bag materials in designated containers

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

(paint, solvents, oil, oil containers, pesticides, fuel)

- This material is not accepted at this Facility
- Ask attendants for directions to nearest depot for proper disposal
- HHW roundups are planned annually in the RDNO – watch for advertising in the fall
