Applicant acknowledges that address information related to open burning permits may be made public. Applicant acknowledges and shall comply with all conditions contained herein.

- **RDNO Open Burning – Fire Regulation Bylaw 2514** (and all amendments thereto)
- The permit is valid only from the date of issuance, with the permit number assigned by RDNO and the signature of the RDNO Inspector.
- **Venting Index must be 55 (“GOOD”) or greater at the time of burn**
- **Prior to burning, obtain Venting Index Information at:**

FEES

Applicant must pay the Permit Application and Inspection Fees at the time of application:

- Class A Burning Permit Application Fee (refundable if Permit is denied):.....\$1,000.00
- Class A Burning Site Inspection (non-refundable): up to three (3) piles is:.....\$100.00
per each additional pile:.....\$25.00
- RDNO will inspect the proposed burn site(s) prior to issuance of a Permit.
- **Payment of Application Fees does not guarantee Permit issuance.**

****Failure to comply with burning regulations may result in a fine and cost recovery should the fire department be required to attend. ****

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Complete and accurately complete the application and email it to the RDNO (reception@rdno.ca) at least seven (7) days before the proposed burn.
2. For Applicants other than the registered property owner, attach a copy of the owner's written authorisation to burn on the subject property to the permit application.
3. Attach a map, drawing or site plan of the property showing:
 - a. the location of all debris piles,
 - b. proximity of the debris piles to property lines,
 - c. proposed dates for the burn, and
 - d. access to the burn location
4. Pay the Class A Open Burning Permit Application and Inspection Fees.
5. RDNO inspector will inspect the site and determine if Class A Open Burning can be conducted.
6. RDNO inspector will contact the Applicant with the inspection results.
7. If approved, the Permit may be issued on-site following inspection.
8. The Class A Open Burning Permit Application Fee will be refunded if it is denied. Please note that inspection fees are non-refundable.
9. A permit must be obtained prior to burning, posted on site, or in the possession of the person(s) conducting the burn and produced on request.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

Provided for convenience only; refer to **Bylaw 2514** for all applicable terms.

- Property must be 1.0 hectares (2.5 acres) or larger
- Burn piles must not exceed 10 metres in diameter and must be inspected by an RDNO inspector
- All material to be burned must have originated from the property
- Burn pile must not contain **prohibited materials**
- Burn pile setbacks must be consistent with the Province of BC's Open Burning Smoke Control Regulation
- Adequate equipment and personnel must be available to ensure the fire is controlled
- The fire must not be left unattended and must be extinguished before persons leave the area
- Open burning shall not be conducted continuously for more than 72 hours

PERMITTED MATERIALS

- debris resulting from land cleared or partially cleared of vegetation to help prepare the land for a non-farming use, and allowed to dry for at least 180 days

PROHIBITED MATERIALS

- Tires, plastics, paint, demolition waste, drywall, Commercial, construction and industrial waste
- Domestic waste, rubber, special waste
- Treated lumber, railway ties

- Asphalt and asphalt products
- **Compostable materials:** including, but not limited to, plants, grass clippings, leaves, tree needles, garden waste, weeds, and manure
- Fuel and lubricant containers
- Recyclable items, including but not limited to paper, cardboard, tin, aluminium, and plastics.
